FROM THE PASTOR

January-February, 2024

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope you had a wonderful and blessed Christmas. It was both for Robin and myself, being able to spend some time with our children and their families and shortly will gather with my extended family. These times are treasured gifts from our God. One of my favorite parts of our gatherings has always been the hymn-singing session we work in; I hope we're able to do this again.

The beginning of a new year is always a good time to look back and forward, making those so-called "resolutions" for change or addition to our habits that we'd like to see happen in our lives. I, for instance, am looking forward to getting knee replacement surgery so I can get up the mountain, fish without falling down, or just walk around our streets! That's going to take a resolution to follow-through with the physical therapy required, no matter the difficulty or pain. Just today I was called to say the surgery's had to be rescheduled for April $3^{\rm rd}$ so there goes a resolution I can start immediately.

A lot of resolutions are like that: they're not something for the moment or easily done – they require work and a change of behavior. It's said that Benjamin Franklin was so disappointed by a sermon he heard on Philippians 4:8 ("Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.") that he went on to develop his famous "13 Virtues" – which I'll let you "google" to find them out. Studies of behavioral change, however, have shown that, however virtuous, any list of 13 changes in a person's lifestyle are not going to be accomplished. Keep it to three or so and you might have a chance.

Wesley, I think, had us more on track when he and the original Methodists looked for three things as evidence of the Christian joining of evangelical faith with evangelical living:

"Do no harm, by avoiding evil of every kind..."

"Do good of every possible sort, and, as far as possible, to all..."

"Attend upon all the ordinances of God – such as public worship; reading the Bible and hearing it expounded upon; sharing in the Sacraments; family and private prayer; fasting or abstinence..."

What the last means has largely remained constant, given its rather obvious meaning; what the first two mean has, frankly, changed slightly over time, given the nature of a changing society. For instance, Methodists were among the first to say that "doing no harm, by avoiding evil of every kind" meant "slaveholding; buying or selling slaves" was not compatible with Christian living. Largely, though, all the examples of what they mean are worth emulating. For instance, in a time in which there are heated discussions about "censorship" and "banning books from libraries", it's well to remember this one injunction about what it means to do no harm by avoiding evil: [Avoid] singing those songs, or reading those books, which do not tend to the knowledge or love of God."

Whatever your 'resolves' for the year may be, I pray that they will bring you closer to the 'knowledge and love of God.'

January 22, 2024 is our next meeting, please join us. If you cannot attend and have any suggestions for our group, please contact Pat Weber, or let a message with Jessica.




Our Spring Craft/Vendor show will be held on March 9th! We will need baked goods for the ladies in the kitchen.
